Health Insurance & Drug Coverage...

In Jackson County, WI. we have an entity called Health & Human Services. My next move...

I knew I had to move fast because today, December 7th, was the last day to sign up for various health insurance programs. Rather than dillydally I immediately called my former insurer. I lucked out.

I was connected to a licensed all insurance salesperson for the company, named Tony. (In Cincinnati) He understood what I was looking to do and took me through the process step-by-step. The total duration of the call was 1 hour 35 minutes.

Speaking with Tony was like a seminar in drug coverage insurance. He explained every detail to me. He exhibited remarkable patience with some of the questions that I asked since I was not well-versed in the subject. It was an education. Much needed and appreciated. The result of the conversation was to return to the way things had been done previously. Further, I was able to realize that the premium is essentially nominal in relation to the discounts that I will enjoy. Another significant factor is that I will be using the same pharmacy that I have been using for years. It's about 10 minutes from my home. They know me and I know them and they are good folks.

I bet you can guess what I did next...

I had Tony's full name, the name of the company that would be providing the drug coverage, and the motivation to write to the CEO of the company to let him know that he had a superior purveyor of information/salesperson on his team. With a few clicks on the keyboard I found the name of the CEO, the address of the company. I was ready to roll.

I wrote a letter to him. Will send tomorrow. I think that after the CEO reads the letter, he will want to clone Tony.

Another cold day - good for cooking chili...
